# mental HEALTH CORNER

**Teamwork** occurs when two or more people collaborate for a common goal. Working together with others and sharing information can be a very positive experience that results in great outcomes. However, it can also be stressful or draining to group participants if the team is not cohesive. Within the Fulton County District Attorney's Office, it is impossible to be successful in serving the community if we do not work collaboratively. Every person in this office brings a unique set of skills and experience that are very beneficial and important. If we focus on communication, respect, and collaboration, teamwork can be a great tool which actually improves mental health.

Effective communication occurs when communication is clear and concise. For example, if there is a team directive to design a program with no parameters, this task may become difficult, confusing, and taxing. In opposition, a clearer directive would be to create an education program for Domestic Violence Awareness month that is hosted after business hours and is easily accessible to the public. This provides a lot more information and clarity that is needed for planning. Be sure that when you communicate on a team you are clear and use minimal jargon so that everyone understands. Often, we may have an idea in our mind, but may not be able to explain it eloquently. Take some time to write things down and make bullet points if necessary. Further, nonverbal communication is very important and does not go unnoticed. Be cognizant of nonverbal cues such as rolling eyes, making frowning faces, and making gestures that show discomfort such as turning your back or folding your arms in frustration.

Respect is essential in creating a seamless teamwork environment. Respect is definitely a part of communication such as not speaking over someone or using offensive language. In addition, it is important to listen to other perspectives before responding as not to appear dismissive. The team may not agree on every decision, but it is important to hear the perspective of others before making a final decision. Also, being respectful of others time is very important. Everyone in this office is extremely busy so please be considerate when making requests with limited turnaround time.

Working with a team can help to decrease your workload and stressors. Building healthy relationships with others can be great because you can continue to collaborate with those individuals in the future. Further working together can provide a broad perspective and showcase a diverse array of ideas. If we continue to work together with effective communication and respect, our office will continue to produce amazing work and service to the community.

# LAW CORNER

## Excited Utterances

Under O.C.G.A. Rule 24-8-803(2), a statement relating to a startling event or condition made while the declarant was under the stress of excitement caused by the event or condition will not be excluded at trial pursuant to the hearsay rule. It is also important to note that this rule does not require the declarant of the excited utterance to actually be made available for trial in order for the statement to be admitted into evidence. To determine whether a statement qualifies as an excited utterance, the Supreme Court of Georgia has held that “[t]he critical inquiry is whether the declarant is still in a state of excitement resulting from that event when the declaration is made. In making that determination, a court should consider the totality of the circumstances.” **Blocker v. State, 2023 Ga. LEXIS 133**. In a lot of circumstance, the utterance is made contemporaneously with the startling event. For example, the declarant saying “I can’t believe Person A is shooting at Person B!” or “We are about to crash!” But what happens if there is a passage of time? The Supreme Court in *Blocker* affirmed that an excited utterance does not have to be made contemporaneously to the startling event. The main inquiry is determining whether the declarant making the utterance was in an “excited state” and the utterance was made under the stress and excitement of the startling event. The Court stated that the length of time that has passed between the event and the statement is only one factor in that determination. **See Varner v. State, 306 Ga. 726** (2019) (affirming admission of statement recorded on responding officer’s body-camera in a murder case where “the stress and excitement caused by the shooting had not yet dissipated”).

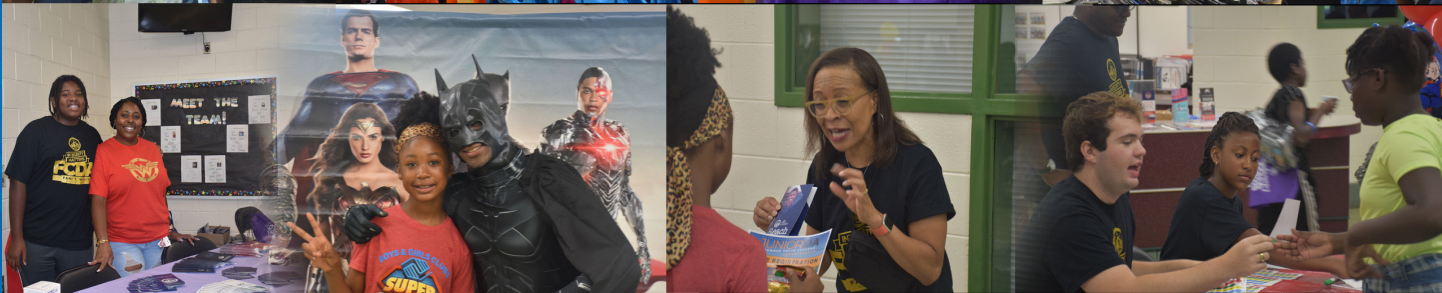


