IMPORTANT PERMIT EXPIRATION INFORMATION

If you have a permit with Fulton County and do not have an approved inspection within any period of 180 days, your permit will expire.

Please take note the <u>2006 International Building Code</u>; <u>Administration</u> <u>Section</u>* quoted below regarding the <u>expiration</u> of the application and the permit:

105.3.2 TIME LIMITATION OF APPLICATION

An Application for a permit for any proposed work shall be deemed to have been abandoned 180 after the date of filing, unless such application has been pursued in good faith or a permit has been issued; except that the building official is authorized to grant one or more extensions of time for additional periods not exceeding 90 days each. The extension shall be requested in writing and justifiable cause demonstrated.

105.5 EXPIRATION

Every permit issued shall become invalid unless the work on the site authorized by such permit is commenced within 180 days after its issuance, or if the work authorized on the site by such permit is suspended or abandoned for a period of 180 days after the time the work is commenced. Construction that has been suspended or abandoned shall be that which does not receive approval of an entire inspection as required by section 109.3. The building official is authorized to grant, in writing, one or more extensions of time, for periods not more than 180 days each. The extension shall be requested in writing and justifiable cause demonstrated.

Once the permit has been issued, be sure you keep the permit and the approved site plan posted on the site, and in clear view of the street, at all times during the construction process.
