Complete and return the following to the Pension Office: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>2022 Part B Affidavit</i> • <i>2022 Retiree Open Enrollment Form</i> and copy of your Medicare card, only if making a change • Supporting documentation for new dependents 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All retirees: Return the <i>2022 Part B Affidavit</i> to keep your County-provided subsidy; you must indicate your Medicare number and your Part A and Part B eligibility dates • To make changes to your coverage: Return the <i>2022 Retiree Open Enrollment Form</i> with a copy of your and your spouse's Medicare ID card(s) • To add a new dependent to your coverage: Include supporting documentation, like a birth certificate or a marriage certificate 	<input type="checkbox"/>
